CapitaLand and CapitaLand Malaysia Mall Trust donate schoolbags worth over RM180,000 to 720 underprivileged children in Malaysia *Donation funded by CapitaLand Hope Foundation*

Kuala Lumpur, 27 November 2015 – CapitaLand Mall Asia, the region’s leading shopping mall developer, owner and manager, and CapitaLand Malaysia Mall REIT Management Sdn. Bhd.¹ (CMRM), the manager of CapitaLand Malaysia Mall Trust (CMMT), are pleased to announce that 720 underprivileged children in Malaysia are benefitting from a RM183,600 donation in the fifth run of the “My Schoolbag” programme in the country this year. The donation is made possible with funding from CapitaLand Hope Foundation, the philanthropic arm of CapitaLand.

My Schoolbag is CapitaLand’s key annual corporate social responsibility (CSR) programme, in which underprivileged children in the five countries where CapitaLand malls operate – Singapore, China, Malaysia, Japan and India – receive schoolbags containing school and daily necessities.

This year’s My Schoolbag programme in Malaysia is benefitting 720 underprivileged children from 27 charity homes – three in Kuala Lumpur, 14 in Selangor, one in Kuantan, seven in Penang and two in Kedah. These charity homes are mainly shelter homes for orphans as well as underprivileged children, which undertake the children’s daily cost of living and provide them with a more favourable living environment.

Starting today, the beneficiaries will be visiting the CapitaLand malls nearest to their charity homes to enjoy a fun-filled half-day programme. They will receive school necessities including a new schoolbag, stationery, socks and shoes worth RM255 each, and be treated to lunch at Sungei Wang Plaza in Kuala Lumpur; Tropicana City Mall in Petaling Jaya; The Mines in Klang Valley; Gurney Plaza and Queensbay Mall in Penang; and East Coast Mall in Kuantan. Games and activities have also been planned for the children. Over 160 staff volunteers will accompany the children in the malls.

Ms Low Peck Chen, CEO of CMRM, said: “Beyond meeting the aspirations and needs of the modern shoppers, our malls serve to enrich the lives of the people and communities where they operate. We are therefore delighted to be bringing joy and hope to underprivileged children in our malls through the My Schoolbag programme. My Schoolbag provides underprivileged

children starting their first year in primary schools with basic school necessities, which are vital in encouraging their active participation in the learning process. We hope that our gift of school and daily necessities will provide the underprivileged children with a head start as they embark on their formal education. We would also like to take this opportunity to thank the staff volunteers, whose continued commitment to the fifth instalment of My Schoolbag in Malaysia exemplifies CapitaLand's 'Building People. Building Communities' credo."

Sungei Wang Plaza, Kuala Lumpur	Persatuan Anak Gembira	Persatuan Anak Gembira is a shelter home that provides for the orphans under its care.
	Yayasan Kebajikan Berkat Kasih Malaysia	Yayasan Kebajikan Berkat Kasih has been established to help many children who are less fortunate.
Tropicana City Mall, Petaling Jaya	Shepherd's Centre Foundation	A foster home for children who are orphaned, abandoned, abused and neglected children from broken families.
	Rumah Juara	Rumah Juara envisions victory for every child's life. The home is a safe haven that protects the children and provides for their physical, mental, emotional and spiritual needs.
	Pandawas Academy	The Pandawas Academy is solely focused on providing quality education to refugee children who have had few privileges in life but whose academic abilities have been proven once given an opportunity to study. As refugees awaiting relocation to another country, the children are not permitted to study in Malaysian public schools. However, the relocation process can take as long as six years or more. The academy provides these children with an opportunity to attend school, so that they do not lose their capacity to improve their academic intelligence.
	Shelter Home 1	Shelter Home 1 is a home for children who have been abused, neglected, abandoned by their families, parents or guardians, or are at risk. Most of the children in the home go to a government school, while those who are weaker in their studies go through a home schooling programme.
	Agathians	Agathians is a legally registered welfare home under the name of Pertubuhan Kebajikan Agathians Malaysia. It is located in Petaling Jaya and is home to a total of 40 boys who are either orphans, abandoned or from

		broken families.
	Pertubuhan Kebajikan Anak Yatim Mary	Pertubuhan Kebajikan Anak Yatim Mary is a foster home for orphans and children from poor, dysfunctional and/or single-parent families. In line with its objective to provide a loving, caring environment, the home aims to provide the children with counselling and encouragement.
The Mines, Klang Valley	Rumah Nur Hikmah	Rumah Nur Hikmah provides shelter for underprivileged children and a better living environment for poor families.
	Pusat Jagaan Rumah Chrestus	Pusat Jagaan Rumah Chrestus provides shelter for underprivileged, abused and abandoned children.
	Pusat Jagaan Rumah Sayangan	Pusat Jagaan Rumah Sayangan demonstrates love by reaching out to underprivileged, abused, abandoned and orphaned children regardless of race, creed or religion, for the enhancement of their holistic well-being.
	House of Joy	House of Joy is a non-profit charitable home that administers shelter, care and training to orphans, children and teens that are underprivileged, abused, abandoned, neglected, poor and delinquent.
	Rumah Charis	Rumah Charis is a non-profit organisation that serves the old, children and youths by offering social services that provide shelter, education and healthy community activities.
	Persatuan Rumah Kids	Persatuan Rumah Kids reaches out to abused, orphaned and abandoned children.
	Pertubuhan Amal Cahaya Tengku Ampuan Rahimah	Pertubuhan Amal Cahaya Tengku Ampuan Rahimah is a non-profit organisation which is a home for orphans and poor girls from all over Malaysia.
	Assunta Children Society	Assunta Children Society is a charitable organisation that provides support and help to the less privileged, poor families and orphaned children.

	Agathians Shelter	Agathians Shelter is a legally registered welfare home that cares for orphans, abandoned children and those from broken families, with the mission to save the children from the streets and to fulfil all essential needs such as shelter, food, education, care, attention and love.
East Coast Mall, Kuantan	Pertubuhan Komuniti Harap Kuantan	Founded in 2012, this non-profit non-governmental organisation's (NGO) mission is to assist needy groups and underprivileged children. This organisation has undertaken a lot of activities over the years, such as providing free English classes to the underprivileged, spreading awareness of conserving the environment, and organising fund raising events. This year, this NGO will find children from underprivileged communities or villages instead of orphanage homes, due to the greater level of need in the former category.
Gurney Plaza, Penang	Crystal Family Home	Crystal Family Home is a non-profit voluntary welfare organisation established in 2009 to help children who need a home.
	House of Hope	House of Hope which started in 2006 at Rifle Range Air Itam is now a registered company with the Companies Act of Malaysia. It is a non-profit company registered for the sole purpose of giving social aid.
	Pusat Jagaan Agape Shalom	Started in 2006, the home currently houses 15 children and seven senior citizens. It is a non-profit organisation fully supported by volunteers.
	Children's Protection Society	The Children's Protection Society is a non-profit NGO catering to the needs of neglected and abandoned children in Penang. It was officially launched in April 1992.
	Rumah Anak Kesayangan	The home was established in early 2008 and is home to 30 orphaned and poor kids.
Queensbay Mall, Penang	Pusat Jagaan Inapan Kasih Sayang	Pusat Jagaan Inapan Kasih Sayang was established to help children in

		their education journeys, through providing financing fees and school uniforms, tuition facilities, religious classes, a mini library, computer rooms and more.
	Rumah Kebajikan Anak Yatim Sungai Petani	Rumah Kebajikan Anak Yatim Sungai Petani, Kedah started with five orphans in October 1975. Since then, the house has grown steadily to take in children from various states in peninsular Malaysia. The home is solely dependent on the kind public for its running cost and receives no other funding.
	Rumah Kebajikan Seri Cahaya	In May 1999, the doors to Rumah Kebajikan Seri Cahaya were opened to serve the needy. It is a non-profit charity organisation.
	Penang Shan's Children Home	The Penang Shan's Children Home was built and officially launched on 14 December 2008. The home administrator is Dr Chandran who, with his fellow caregivers, looks after over 20 children aged between 7 and 15 years.
